They find 'lodgings' in old buildings, looking for small gaps under the eaves to nest in the roof space. In Addingham nests are found in the older parts of the village, around Main Street and Chapel Street particularly. Listen out for them as they form screaming parties, swooping low over the street and roof tops.

As you walk down Main Street see if you can spot poo streaks on the stonework just below the eaves.
