## **School Woodland Birds**

Pause a moment and listen out for bird song.
This section of the path going down towards
the School wetland, is where the greatest
variety of birds are seen and heard on the
Primary School section of our regular monthly
transect walk, from The Sawmill to Sugar Hill.









On the April (2021) walk as well as seeing woodpigeon, blue tit, robin & long tailed tit, the song of a chiffchaff was clearly heard, a spring migrant to these parts.



The chiffchaff is a small olive-brown warbler which actively flits through trees and shrubs, with a distinctive tail-wagging movement. It's song sounds like its name! Chiff—Chaff.

It picks insects from trees and also flies out to snap them up in flight.
