## Making space for nature @ The Gala Field



The grass on the bank is left unmown through the summer, so wildflowers can grow and set seed, and bees and butterflies can collect the nectar and pollen.

In the early autumn Bradford Council cut the grass and AEG volunteers rake off the grass ready for the Council to collect for composting. At the far end of the bank there is a good patch of brambles, excellent wildlife habitat, providing food (nectar, pollen and fruit) for insects, birds and small mammals, as well as shelter and nesting places.

friendly habitat and combat
climate change at this
greenspace.
